

GIS Manager Brad Carone’s job is to develop maps that are instrumental to the Engineering and Maintenance Departments. Carone graduated from Central Michigan University with a degree in Geographic Information Systems, and took a job in Texas for a utility company doing infrared imaging. He then went on to e then went on to work for Consumers Energy in Lansing mapping gas lines. His next job provided an opportunity to work in Dubai for eight months for the Dubai Electricity and Water Authority. This was a car lover’s dream with Bugatti’s and Ferrari’s down every street.



Carone continues to learn skills that have proven to be very useful to GCRC such as coding. “Being able to have everything working correctly is my favorite part, building the apps for everybody to use,” he said.
