As we are in the midst of a very busy construction season, I am pleased with the progress made thus far. On Wednesday, July 27, the Road Commission cut the ribbon on our brand new South Dort Highway extension. The road was a long one, but I thank all of the Genesee County Road Commission employees who worked hard on this project. In addition, our maintenance department has made significant progress on the pavement repair and chip seal program. The paving crew tackled more than 60 miles, and our chip seal crew picked up very shortly after. The Engineering Department is managing \$31,035,200 in heavy construction projects, including \$15,855,200 million federal aid projects and \$15,180,000 million local and primary projects. This year's largest project was the Dort Highway project in Grand Blanc Township. There is still much more to be done this season. As stewards of the roads, our job is never complete. Keep up the good work, and please stay safe.

The GCRC trunklines maintenance crew has been hard at work this summer, completing pavement repair in early July and beginning chip seal operations that same week. More than 60 miles have been paved and more than 130 miles will be chip sealed and fog sealed.

The Genesee County Road Commission will have a booth at this year's Back to the Bricks event. It's a great opportunity to connect with the residents we serve and teach them about what we do.




