When there is snow in the forecast, GCRC's maintenance department is already planning how to tackle it. GCRC uses a combination of technology and years of experience. We rely on weather and pavement forecasts and our supervisors' expertise when deciding how to respond to a winter storm. There are also cameras positioned throughout the county to check the conditions in real time. These tools and more help garage supervisors determine which treatment is right. But many of them began as equipment operators and have worked for GCRC for years, gaining knowledge of how different products work in

different conditions.
This hands-on experience is invaluable when deciding which solution will work best. Variables such as the wind, pavement temperature, possible rain, and more can impact how a product works. While every storm is different, GCRC's garage supervisors have the know-how and the resources to make the right call.


